Public Safety Report March, 2019

Statistical Highlights

During the month of March, there were five reported NIBRS part 1 offenses, compared with five for the month of February and four during the month of March last year. Officers made five in-custody or field release arrest in March for Simple Assault, Fraudulent use of Identifying Information, Credit/Debit Card Abuse, Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and VCO Cruelty to Animals.

Officers responded to 16 Traffic Crashes, compared to 16 for February, and this resulted in nine crash reports being created. All nine of our crashes this month occurred on Bee Cave Road.

In March, our officers made 320 traffic stops, resulting in 242 violations (76%), and 199 warnings (62%). Of the violations that were cited, 222 (69%) were for speeding, including 32 for speeding in a school zone. Officers also wrote six citations for failing to stop or remain stopped for a school bus. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 20 violations and 19 warnings.

During March, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 195 calls for service, compared to 173 calls for service in February. During the month, 39 reports were generated. Officers also conducted 73 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 75 for February.

Investigations

In March, Detective Torres was assigned five new cases. Detective Torres currently has 45 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 166 hours of training, including classes in "Crisis Intervention", "Court Security Officer", "Civilian Interaction", "De-Escalation" and "Body Worn Camera".
