Public Safety Report January, 2019

Statistical Highlights

During the month of January, there were eight reported NIBRS part 1 offenses, compared with six for the month of December and seven during the month of January last year. Officers made one in-custody or field release arrest in January for Possession of Marijuana.

Officers responded to 21 Traffic Crashes, compared to 11 for December, and this resulted in six crash reports being created. Six crashes this month occurred on Bee Cave Road.

In January, our officers made 180 traffic stops, resulting in 136 violations (75%), and 121 warnings (67%). Of the violations that were cited, 87 (64%) were for speeding, including 25 for speeding in a school zone. Officers also wrote two citations for failing to stop or remain stopped for a school bus. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 9 violations and 12 warnings.

During January, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 207 calls for service, compared to 233 calls for service in December. During the month, 35 reports were generated. Officers also conducted 141 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 109 for December.

Investigations

In January, Detective Torres was assigned 16 new cases. Of these 16 cases, seven were closed or suspended in January – nine are carrying over into February. Detective Torres currently has 34 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 101 hours of training, including classes in “Civilian Interaction” and “Supervisor Liability”.
