

Statistical Highlights

During the month of December, there were six reported NIBRS part 1 offenses, compared with eight for the month of November and six during the month of December last year. Officers made eight in-custody or field release arrests in December – two for Warrants, one for DWI, one for Felon in Possession of Firearm, one for Possession of Marijuana, one for Driving While License Invalid and two for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

Officers responded to 11 Traffic Crashes, compared to 18 for November, and this resulted in 11 crash reports being created. Eight crashes this month occurred on Bee Cave Road.

In December, our officers made 153 traffic stops, resulting in 95 violations (62%), and 95 warnings (62%). Of the violations that were cited, 54 (35%) were for speeding, including six for speeding in a school zone. Officers also wrote one citation for failing to stop or remain stopped for a school bus. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 9 violations and 10 warnings.

During December, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 233 calls for service, compared to 231 calls for service in November. During the month, 21 reports were generated. Officers also conducted 109 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 123 for November.

Investigations

In December, Detective Torres was assigned 11 new cases. Of these 11 cases, seven were closed or suspended in December – four are carrying over into December. Detective Torres currently has 25 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 212 hours of training, including classes in "Civilian Interaction", "Deescalation Techniques", "Crisis Intervention" and multiple courses in "IT Security".
