Public Safety Report May, 2017

Investigations

In May, Detective Torres was assigned 15 new cases. 11 of these cases were closed in May and 4 are carrying over into June. Detective Torres currently has 9 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 158 hours of training, including classes in “Standardized Field Sobriety”, “Social Media - Networking”, “Taser Instructor Certification”, “Human Trafficking” and numerous “Computer Spam/Spoofing” awareness classes.

Statistical Highlights

During the month of May, there were five reported Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) part 1 offenses, compared with five for the month of April and eight during the month of May last year. Officers made eight arrests during the month – two for Minor in Possession of Alcohol, one for Consumption of Alcohol by a Minor, one for Public Intoxication, two for Driving while License Invalid, one for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and one for Possession of a Controlled Substance.

Officers responded to 33 Traffic Collisions, compared to 31 for April, and this resulted in nine crash reports being created. Our most common collision location this month requiring a police report was the 4000-4100 block of Bee Cave Road.

In May, our officers made 271 traffic stops, issuing 197 citations (72.7%) resulting in 216 violations, and 102 warnings (34.5%). Of the violations that were cited, 144 (66.7%) were for speeding, including 13 citations for Speeding in a School Zone. In the 14 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 58 violations and 31 warnings.

During May, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 313 calls for service compared to 262 for April. This resulted in 24 reports being generated. Officers also conducted 107 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 122 for April.
