Public Safety Report July, 2017

Investigations

In July, Detective Torres was assigned 18 new cases. Nine of these cases were closed or suspended in July and nine are carrying over into August. Detective Torres currently has 14 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 222 hours of training, including classes in “De-Escalation Training”, “Sexual Assault/Family Violence Investigator Class”, “Investigating Officer Involved Shootings”, “Spanish for Law Enforcement”, and numerous “Computer Social Engineering/ Computer Security” awareness classes.

Statistical Highlights

During the month of July, there were 13 reported Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) part 1 offenses, compared with eight for the month of June and 10 during the month of July last year. Officers made six arrests during the month – two for warrants, one for Theft – Shoplifting, one for DWI, one for an Open Container in a vehicle, and one for Driving While License Invalid (2nd offense).

Officers responded to 17 Traffic Collisions, compared to 53 for June, and this resulted in nine crash reports being created. Our most common collision location this month requiring a police report was the 5600 block of Bee Cave Road. Of the nine crashes requiring a police report, eight of them occurred on Bee Cave Road.

In July, our officers made 241 traffic stops, issuing 153 citations (63.5%) resulting in 177 violations, and 113 warnings (46.9%). Of the violations that were cited, 95 (53.7%) were for speeding, three were for violation of the hands free ordinance and two were for after-hours construction. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 29 violations and 24 warnings.

During July, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 291 calls for service compared to 317 for June. This resulted in 37 reports being generated. Officers also conducted 313 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 238 for June.
