Public Safety Report June, 2018

Investigations

In June, Detective Torres was assigned 16 new cases. Of these 16 cases, nine were closed or suspended in June – seven are carrying over into July. Detective Torres currently has 13 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 165 hours of training, including classes in “Courtroom Security Officer”, “Intermediate Crime Scene Search”, “Explosive Ordnance Training”, “Money Laundering/Financial Crimes”, and multiple Computer Security Awareness classes.

Statistical Highlights

During the month of June, there were twelve reported NIBRS part 1 offenses, compared with five for the month of May and eight during the month of June last year. Officers made eight in-custody or field release arrests in June – one for Forgery, one for Possession of THC, one for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, two for Possession of Marijuana, one for Minor in Possession of Alcohol, and two for Consumption of Alcohol by a Minor.

Officers responded to 25 Traffic Crashes, compared to 30 for May, and this resulted in 12 crash reports being created. Our most common crash location this month requiring a police report was Bee Cave Road, with 8 of our 12 crashes happening on Bee Cave Road.

In June, our officers made 231 traffic stops, issuing 119 citations (51.5%) resulting in 129 violations, and 140 warnings (60.6%). Of the violations that were cited, 82 (63.5%) were for speeding. Since school is no longer in session, we had no citations for speeding in a school zone or failure to stop or remain stopped for a school bus. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 13 violations and 28 warnings.

During June, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 231 calls for service, compared to 221 calls for service in May. During the month, 63 reports were generated. Officers also conducted 72 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 67 for May.
