Public Safety Report May, 2018

Investigations

In May, Detective Torres was assigned 10 new cases. Of these 10 cases, seven of them were closed or suspended in May – three are carrying over into June. Detective Torres currently has 10 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 249 hours of training, including classes in “Courtroom Security Officer”, “Sexual Assault/Family Violence Investigator”, “Active Shooter”, “Radar Certification”, “Sexual Assault Investigations”, and “Interacting with Drivers Who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing”.

Statistical Highlights

During the month of May, there were five reported NIBRS part 1 offenses, compared with eight for the month of April and five during the month of May last year. Officers made five arrests in May – four for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and one for Driving Under the Influence (Minor).

Officers responded to 30 Traffic Crashes, compared to 18 for April, and this resulted in 12 crash reports being created. Our most common crash location this month requiring a police report was Bee Cave Road, with 10 of our 12 crashes happening on Bee Cave Road.

In May, our officers made 354 traffic stops, issuing 209 citations (59.0%) resulting in 238 violations, and 181 warnings (51.1%). Of the violations that were cited, 151 (63.4%) were for speeding, and 15 of these 151 speeding violations were for speeding in a school zone. In addition, we issued eight citations for failure to stop or remain stopped for a school bus. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 32 violations and 34 warnings, including 9 violations and 8 warnings on Ridgewood.

During May, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 221 calls for service, compared to 186 calls for service in April. During the month, 52 reports were generated. Officers also conducted 67 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 46 for April.
